WILDFIRE REBATE PROGRAM

In 2025, residents of the Town of Lyons will be eligible for a match of up to \$500 towards wildfire mitigation activities via a rebate. Boulder County will be continuing their program which also offers up to \$500 to homeowners who complete eligible mitigation activities. The Lyons program will utilize the same eligible mitigation activities as Boulder County but will also require an **Individual Home Assessment** which is offered by Wildfire Partners. Please note that Boulder County does NOT require a home assessment to claim a rebate.

CURBSIDE LIMB PICK UP JUNE 9

The Town of Lyons will be scheduling services for a curbside limb pick up for residential properties that are less than one acre on Monday, June 9, 2025. The following rules and regulations regarding the service will apply. Please review the guidelines.

- Piles must be stacked curbside by 7 am on Monday, June 9, 2025.
- Max pile size is 5' x 5' x 5'. One pile per household. Piles that are larger or don't comply will be skipped.
- Branches and Limbs Only. No grasses, weeds, loose yard waste, treated lumber or compost.

CUL-DE-SACS AND PODS

The Board of Trustees recently approved several amendments to the Lyons Municipal Code. Vehicles parked in cul-de-sacs must be positioned parallel to the curb, with the passenger side wheels along the outside of the curb. It is unlawful for head-in or back-in parking in cul-de-sacs. Portable storage containers (PODs) **cannot** be parked in the public right of way or on any public street in the Town, so as not to impede traffic flow, obstruct the view of other vehicles or create a hazard.

HELPFUL UPDATES

It is illegal to block a sidewalk with your vehicle.

Refrain from parking across a sidewalk – you could be preventing someone with a disability or a child from making their way safely through town.

Wet wipes are not flushable? Nationwide, more than \$1 billion in damage occurs annually from the flushing of wet wipes. Please do your part and **throw them in the trash** not the toilet!

Timed Entry Permit Reservations are required, along with a park pass or entrance fee, to enter Rocky Mountain National Park through October. There are two different access options for timed entry permits access with Bear Lake Road (Park Access+) and access without Bear Lake Road (Park Access).
