



PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Trustees and staff have committed to making Lyons an inclusive and welcoming community for all, including the LGBTQ+ community; and

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court ruled in June 2015 that same-sex couples can marry nationwide, establishing a new civil right in our country; and

WHEREAS, former president Barack Obama designated the first national monument to LGBTQ+ rights in June 2016, honoring the LGBTQ+ community's long-term presence and struggle for equality across our nation; and

WHEREAS, all members of the Lyons community, including those who are lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, non-binary, gender-expansive, queer or questioning, intersex, and asexual have the right to feel safe, not be discriminated against, and to live without the threat of harassment; and

WHEREAS, the Town has added protections for LGBTQ+ individuals and families, including partner health benefits and an inclusive employee non-discrimination policy; and

WHEREAS, supporting Lyons' LGBTQ+ community also aligns with the Town's strategic objective to co-create a more inclusive and equitable community that promotes unity and honors diversity; and

WHEREAS, the LGBTQ+ community has made great strides; however, work remains in order to achieve full equality, inclusion, and acceptance.

WHEREAS, we as a town and as individuals desire to practice respect, kindness, and understanding and teach these traits to future generations.

The Town of Lyons affirms its commitment to the promotion and protection of the human rights of LGBTQ residents in the community and urges all residents to respect and honor our diverse community and celebrate and build a culture of inclusiveness and acceptance.
