We have also had 3 near misses this year in our car when making the left-hand turn from Stone Canyon onto Hwy 66.</p> <p>I have stood at the corner right near Den Rec and have witnessed drivers literally speed up to make the light when they should be slowing down. They have plenty of time and space.</p> <p>I/we realize that some of this behavior is reflective of people's values and attitudes, and that can only change from within. Is there any consideration for a red light camera or increased police patrols near that light? Red light cameras and additional police patrol are likely very costly, but there will be a massive accident there very soon which could be much worse. We would like the Town to consider these options, especially since Lyons and RMNP continue to see an increased amount of visitors.</p>		Yes

Above ground electric is arguably the single biggest risk to a disaster in Lyons, particularly now that Lyons has mitigated flood risk. The budget allocates \$264K for the solar farm which is nice but does nothing to mitigate the risk of a major disaster from above ground electric causing a wildfire. You need to have a 3 to 5 year plan to eliminate all above ground electric, not a token \$100k per year. I realize that would require substantial supplemental funding. You should be aggressively pursuing this including seeking taxpayer support for funding including the issuance of municipal bonds, tax/fee increases, as well as grants. The streets in old town Lyons are in need of major repair. You similarly need to do more to address this.
