Grit, Grace & Gratitude: A Ten-Year Commemoration of the Flood: Despite a deluge of rain during the picnic and music, the official ceremony, exhibits, tours, presentations, and candlelight vigil were amazing! We have received positive feedback from many people letting us know that they appreciated the events and effort put forth to commemorate and document the disaster in our community's history. The *Redstone Review, September 13 2023, edition* has full coverage. There was widespread coverage by Denver news stations, numerous newspapers, and radio stations. Governor Polis, Senators Hickenlooper and Bennet, and Congressman Neguse were all present. The staff has sent follow-up notes of appreciation to the presenters.

- The Artisan Market was held on Saturday, September 9 at Bohn Park. There were 40 local artists and a fundraiser for the Lyons Community Foundation. Vendors and visitors all reported good sales and enjoyed a beautiful day. We may want to continue this event in the fall next year.
- St Vrain Invitational Cross Country Events will be held September 15 and 16th with 900 and 1,700 participants expected each day. The district did a door hanger on every house in the neighborhood asking them for patience with the parking that day.
- We're excited to kick off the new **Lyons Wayfinding Planning Process** with Design Week! During the week, members of the design team will be hosting open hours at the Lyons Regional Library, as well as stopping in at the coffee shops in town.
