There are holes in the road. There are potholes in the road. One pothole was fixed earlier in 2024 after I submitted a request. I have been told by our HOA that this is a town budget issue. The cracks were filled in the summer of 2021, but only with sand which blew away within hours. In 2022, Stone Canyon Drive was used more frequently by hauling trucks taking materials from the Hwy 7 repairs up to the quarry for re-purpose. In our neighborhood, Eagle Valley Drive was repaved in 2023, yet Stone Canyon Drive remains damaged.</p> <p>Additionally, we need some sort of safety measures at the McConnell/Stone Canyon stoplight. I've lost count at how many times I've almost been hit in the crosswalk regardless of walking, running, biking or driving. It's to the point where I almost wait 5-10 seconds before crossing when I have the right-of-way. A red light camera or increased patrolling should be a priority and not wait until 2025. It's a matter of time before someone is seriously injured or killed at this stoplight. I realize that changing the bad driving habits is unlikely, but as a Town, we should try to hold this bad behavior accountable.</p>
