2025 MUNICIPAL BUDGET

The Town budget process is one of the most important policy decisions made by the Board of Trustees. During this process, funds are allocated for the next year to ensure we have the services and resources available that make Lyons one of the best places in Colorado to live.

Municipal budgets must be balanced; Town expenses must not exceed revenue, and a minimum amount must be held in reserves. Department supervisors and the Town Administrator review staff recommendations for the budget beginning in July and August. Then, the Town's Board of Trustees review and adjust areas based on citizen input and other financial priorities.

Citizens are welcome to attend upcoming Board of Trustees meetings to hear more about the funding sources and expenses that are being determined for 2025. The Town's 2025 draft budget has been submitted to the BOT and is available online at townoflyons.com/budget

FATS, OILS, & GREASE (FOG)

Now that we are heading into the big cooking season, it's a good time to remind everyone that dumping Fats, Oils, and Grease (F.O.G.) down your drain is never a good idea.

After a while, the grease builds up and causes sewer backups, which are not fun and can be expensive to fix. Instead of rinsing them down your drain, pour the leftover drippings and grease into a disposable container and allow it to cool before disposing of it in the trash. Then wipe out the pan with a paper towel before you wash it.

These simple tips will help keep your plumbing healthy and minimize sewage backups.

CHANGING SEASONS

It has been a long, hot summer, and fall is finally upon us. That means less weeding and mowing but more raking and shoveling. We want to thank you now for being a good neighbor this fall and winter. Raking leaves in your yard for bagging or mulching and not into the street keeps them from clogging up the Town's stormwater drains and street sweepers. As we approach snow season, please remember to remove snow from your sidewalks within 24 hours of a storm ending. Keeping your sidewalk clear allows kids to walk to their school and adults to get some exercise or walk their dogs, and it is greatly appreciated.
