Highlights

- Staff has been attending the Informational Meetings with EPA, CSP, Lyons Fire, CDHPE and Boulder County regarding the gasoline spill in late April. Updating residents via eblast. Fact Sheet was published by EPA and posted on Town website.
- EVC
 - EVC has 7 members and working on business friendly goals, supporting creativity and curiosity regarding the Eastern Corridor Development.
 - Supported a Revitalizing Main St Grant to add solar bollard lighting along 4th Ave and ambient string lighting above the sidewalks on the block between 4th and 5th Ave on Main ST.
 - High priority goals include being of support for the Town Comp Plan and creating a user- friendly resource guide for potential new or expanding businesses.
 - Energize Colorado reached out regarding three local businesses to feature as part of their Can Do Colorado Campaign
 - Business License Renewals are in process. Working with planning, community development and utilities staff for any businesses with any use changes.
 - Article in Redstone Review May is Historic Preservation Month
- Revolving Loan Fund Update
 - 17 loans out. 4 COVID related loans have been repaid fully. All others are currently being paid back on time.
 - \$78K to loan currently.
- Outreach
 - Public meetings planned for Safe Route to School (SRTS) and 4th Ave Ped Bridge on May 13 and May 18.

 - Updated residents about 2nd Ave Bridge Construction.

It was a hugely successful cleanup on Saturday! The community really turned out, we estimate 112 volunteers plus organizers scouring all over the river corridor and beyond. We even got some playground mulch turned and fluffed up in preparation for summer, it was just amazing.

Estimates of our results, we did weigh things as best we could and estimated some of the larger items:

- 165.6 pounds of recyclable materials collected and diverted to recycling
- 337 pounds of trash pulled from the river corridor, surrounding trails and Town property
- Plus an estimated over 200 pounds of scrap metal set aside for diversion including a buried trailer frame that was excavated from the Martin Parcel, a large TV antenna, a carburetor of some kind and more.
