EMERGENCY BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETING 12:00 PM

- I. Roll Call and Pledge of Allegiance Present: Mayor Angelo, Mayor Pro Tem Browning, Trustee Lowell, Trustee Rogin, Trustee Karavas Absent: Trustee Waugh, Trustee Miller
- II. Update on Gas Spill Emergency - Administrator Simonsen provided update on tanker that rolled on HWY 36 by Apple Valley Bridge, loaded with 8,000 gallons of gasoline. Trustee Waugh joined the meeting at 12:05 pm. Calls from Apple Valley residents and crews working on 2nd Ave Bridge. Notified all Ditch Companies. City of Longmont, and all other agencies. Ponds are not fed by the river, ground water, should not be impacted. Highlands Ditch stated they draw from the bottom and gasoline floats on top; he thought they would be fine. EPA is now in charge; fortunate it was not diesel. The turbidity of our water, with the drops is making the water churn and getting the fuel under the water. They would be sampling every few hours to monitor if gasoline levels were going down, at several areas in town. New crew this morning to continue monitoring. Water sampling can take 24 hours and due to turbidity, they just don't know how it will react. River was up quite a bit today. I don't want to alarm anyone, but we do need to keep people away/out of the river. Staff this morning posted signs around areas where people access/congregate at the river. EPA advice is to avoid contact with the river and do not remove the fish. They have found fish 4 miles down the stream. If people remove the fish, Division of Fish and Wildlife won't get an accurate count. Definite affect on aquatic life, which then affects bears, mountain lions. After today, EPA will develop a cleanup plan. Could be as simple as Longmont opening up the dam and flushing the river or we could be cleaning individual stones. It is still too early to know, could take a few more days. EPA recommends: NO River access, keep animals out of the river, do not remove dead fish or leave them on the banks, as other animals will eat them. If you have removed dead fish, please report your counts to Ben Rodman at 823-6622 x 22. We want accurate counts, not secondhand reports. We are probably talking in the 1,000's. We all need to be patient as this is still unfolding. Working with Mike Chard with the County, BOCO Public Health and they are discussing drinking water wells on Apple Valley, they say they should not be impacted. Those residents need to be in touch with Boulder County Public Health. Meeting at 1pm to debrief and then a formal statement will be issued. This could be minor or could have cascading effects. There are a variety of mitigation issues. Prepping local emergency for tomorrow's meeting in case there is state/federal funding we

would be eligible. Attorney Dittman has disaster proclamation drafted for Mayor to sign and we can extend if needed. Trustee Miller joined the meeting at 12:17 pm. Resolution extending that tomorrow. If it impacts our parks and local businesses, we want to be eligible for reimbursements. Trustee Rogin asked if gas is still spilling, and if we know the cause of crash. Administrator Simonsen said gas is not running into the river any longer and the cause of the crash has not been determined. Mayor Pro Tem Browning asked is this Saturday's river clean up still on? Administrator Simonsen, working with Ben Rodman, once we hear from EPA today, we can find out. Trustee Karavas asked health status of driver? Administrator Simonsen stated he was injured, not a fatality. I am also in contact with Longmont Raw Water Resources, they are monitoring and diverted it from the plant yesterday, they have not heard from the EPA. BOT to be updated as information comes in.
