

Dear: Mayor Nicholas Angelo

This is a letter of formal complaint against one of your Trustees, Wendy Miller. I have previously filed a complaint against Trustee Miller in 2020. The complaint is attached in the exhibits list. The crux of the complaint is that Miller used her position of trust as an elected official to aid in her husband's contentious behavior to interfere in my business interest and my plans to build a runway in Weld County where her husband and I were direct competitors.

Miller told a divisive lie to the Weld County Commissioners that I used my aircraft in a reckless and dangerous manner to persuade the Commissioners that I am dangerous and therefore my request for use permit should be denied.

Wendy's response both at the board meeting and in her written response do not align with the realities of her efforts or her insistence the Mr. Morrow is somehow just her baby's father and that she has nothing at stake in her husband's business. Now Miller has handed over her computer and allowed her husband Morrow, to access her Lyons Zoom account to so he could attend two separate depositions of witnesses in the legal matter his actions triggered. Exhibit 003 – Miller states “For some background info: This is an ongoing legal battle for land use in Weld County. I am not named in the lawsuit nor do I have any degree of ownership or claim to the aviation business cited in the lawsuit..”

Exhibit 004 – On March 15th 2020 Miller gave an interview to the Daily Camera and states under her professional background “Owner of a commercial and residential cleaning company, assist husband with skydiving company, Rocky Mountain Skydive.”

Exhibit 005 – The FAA investigated this claim and found that “Investigation and Finding: This allegation was not substantiated. 1. Based on review of satellite imagery, the area would not be considered a congested area. 2. N5911B was operating in and around the area. 3. Based on radar review, any violation of minimum safe altitudes could not be substantiated” For reference that “minimum safe altitude” would be 500 feet above the ground.

The language “could not be substantiated” is a very artistic way of saying that this complaint was a lie. I am not so creative and can only call Trustee Miller a liar and not a good one. I just showed you three very good examples of a liar but I don't what to stop there.

Exhibit 006 – Miller, assisting her husband in fighting the lawsuit I brought against him, downloads Venmo payments made to me for services provided to send to Morrow's lawyer and ends her email with “It also shows a bit of their character. - Wendy Miller” I was running a legal business so what exactly is she referring to with my character?

1. PURPOSE

The purposes of this Code of Ethical Standards are to: A. Identify **minimum** standards of ethical conduct for Town Officers and Employees;

2. GENERAL POLICIES

A. Duty. All Town Officers and Employees have a duty to use their public positions to contribute to the public good..... Town Officers and Employees must be mindful that the appearance of impropriety can be as corrosive of public confidence as actual impropriety, and therefore must strive to avoid situations which may create an appearance of impropriety.

5. ETHICAL STANDARDS

3). refrain from promoting personal agendas that conflict or do not align with the best interests of the Town.

6). be honest and truthful and to act with integrity at all times.

7). strive to make the highest standards of ethical behavior their personal ethical standards.

13). remember that they are “ambassadors” of the Town of Lyons and as such, should interact with all persons and entities whether in public or in private in a respectful and fair manner at all times.

15). not grant any special consideration, treatment, or advantage to any citizen or resident of the town beyond that which is available to every other citizen, resident or business of the town.

16). not request or permit the use of Town-owned vehicles, equipment, materials, or property for personal convenience or profit except when such services are available to the public generally or are provided in an express Town policy for the use of such Town Officer in the conduct of official business.

26). interact with all persons and entities in a respectful and fair manner at all times, and should not criticize any member of the public for his or her requests or views.

Conduct in General

10). Town Officers should serve as a model of leadership and civility to the community.
