#### 6. Old Business

- a. Lyons Valley Park Zoning - Sarah provided the HPC's comments (i.e. Declining to Provide Recommendation) to the BOT.

- Sarah L submitted that HPC has "no comment."

- b. Historic Designation Plaques Have Been Ordered (2)

- We went with the least expensive option and included Steamboat mountain on the plaque.
- Paid for 2 and delivery TBD.

- d. Protecting Lyons' Historic Main Street

- Suggested changes to municipal codes to incorporate elements to protect

‘character defining historical features’. Lindsey mentioned identifying a boundary with contributing and non-contributing structures. Sarah to share and draft suggestions for the Town of Lyons and share with BOT.

- Lindsay gave information on Municipal Codes from Salida, Carbondale, Colorado Springs.
- Sarah wants to compare these with Lyons to make change with more “actionable teeth.”

e. Land Acknowledgement - Lack of Actionable Goals

- Kristen, Lori, and Sarah met with Chelsea, Mia, and Tribal Representatives about goals for 2025 commemorative events; is using \$1000 from 2024 budget realistic?

- Exploring Park Buy Out (\$4400 p/Day in 2023 for LaVern - would be more in 2025), Artisan Market Space, and Additional Opportunities to Share Knowledge
- We have \$1,000 budget money and want to use it responsibly.
- Meeting didn’t have actionable results.
- Chelsea and Mia made the introduction, which we appreciate.
- Holly Rogin is happy to help with introductions to Indigenous community leaders as well. She has professional experience in this area.
- Good chance we won’t spend the \$1,000 in 2024.
- Might we add plaques to areas/parks in town that acknowledge the Indigenous tribes that were here before?
- Great idea but it might not happen before the end of the year.
- We’ll consider pursuing this idea in the future.

*Motion:* Gil moves that the HPC in 2025 calendar year strive to identify and designate origins of key town properties.

#### 2024 Budget

- Request #1 Description: Certified Local Government (CLG) Subgrant: Historic Context Survey, Local Match Requirement (5.67% of Grant); Deadline for completion of Historic Context Survey is April 1, 2025.
  - Amount \$1500.00
- Request #2 Description: Funds to design and create bronze plaques for property owners who choose to designate their property as a Historic Property, recognized by the Town of Lyons and State of Colorado. The plaques would be displayed on the exterior of the property, identifying it as a Local Landmark. The City of Longmont issues a plaque like the one below. Rough cost estimates are \$125 p/plaque; the requested budget is for 5 properties to be designated in 2024.
  - Amount \$625.00
- Request #3 Description: Funds to organize and host 2-3 porch talks in 2024. Topics would likely focus on historic properties (to support the HPC's work in rolling out our Historic Designation Program) and/or the History of Lyons (to support the HPC's work on the Historic Context Survey Grant).
  - Amount \$1000.00
