GARDEN IN A BOX PROGRAM

In partnership with the City of Longmont and the St. Vrain Left Hand Water Conservancy District, Town of Lyons water utility customers can take part in the Garden In A Box program – a water-wise, pre-planned garden of native plants offered by Resource Central.

The gardens are a selection of six professionally designed perennial, xeric gardens that include 14-50 starter plants, a plant and care guide and plant-by-number maps for each garden type.

Beginning March 1, residents can go to resourcecentral.org/gardens/ and order a garden. Order soon as these gardens go fast!

After the discounts are gone, both Town of Lyons residents and anyone living in unincorporated Boulder County can still order the gardens at the normal, undiscounted price.

The gardens go on sale March 1 and will be available for pickup in May and June.



SNOWY SEASON

March is typically a snowy month. With winter upon us, remember commercial and residential sidewalks are required to be cleared within 24 hours after a snowstorm.



PUBLIC TRANSPORT OPTIONS

The Town of Lyons and Boulder County zTrip program continues in 2023. Vouchers for zTrip transportation are valid every day of the week, 5am-7pm, between Longmont and to/from Boulder when the Lyons Flyer is not in service.

zTrip transportation vouchers are available for those who need them through town hall. Also, the Lyons Flyer is free to all who ride it, with no pass required.

STORMWATER & MORE

Keeping Stormwater Clean, Because We're All Downstream

Colorado Water: A lot of people depend on it. The snow that falls in the Colorado Rockies, not only provides water to about five million Coloradans, but also to people living in 18 other states. Colorado is the only state besides Hawaii where water flows out of its borders, but doesn't flow in.

What can you do?

Don't discharge soaps, solvents, oil, sand, yard clippings, paint or other materials into the storm sewer system, roadways or drainage ditches. Pollutants that flow through storm drains and into the storm sewer system go directly into streams and waterways without being treated properly. Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly and consider their impact in the runoff.



RECYCLING AND COMPOST

The Town of Lyons and Boulder County have partnered to provide residents with a free single-stream Recycling Center on 2nd Ave. For residents who are home compost customers, there are changes to residential compost collection with Western Disposal beginning this month. The updated compost rules are simple! Two categories ONLY:

Food Scraps: Produce, bread, bones, meat, cheese, eggshells, coffee grounds (no coffee filters), etc. REMOVE ALL produce decals, rubber bands, strings, twist-ties, and anything that is NOT food.

Yard & Plant Trimmings: Leaves, twigs, branches, flowers, grass, and yard trimmings.

Place items LOOSE (unbagged) in your home compost cart. That's it!



PAWS UP!

Your dog license fees help support the dog clean up stations and bags as well as the Lyons Dog Park.

BEAR RESISTANT TRASH BINS

In partnership with Boulder County Parks & Open Space, Lyons is one of the beneficiaries of a Colorado Parks and Wildlife Grant. Our shared goals are: to broaden our communities' efforts to reduce conflicts, update human habits, and test out solutions that are working in other communities.

What does this mean for you as a resident of Lyons? Certain homeowners in Town may be eligible for a bear-resistant trash can at a significantly reduced price (between 0 and \$30). More information and an online order form should be ready in mid-March, with local pickup scheduled for late April. Details will be in the town eblasts.
