PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Boulder County continues to work with RTD and the Town of Lyons regarding 2026 public transportation services. The zTrip Voucher Program for those who need transportation options is available again in 2026. Reach out to recreation@townoflyons.com for more information.

Lyons residents need to download and install the MyRide app, in order to access free use of any RTD bus or light rail including rides to the airport, and around Boulder, Longmont, and Denver. ANNUAL PARKING PASS

The annual parking pass for parks in Lyons, including LaVern Johnson and Bohn Park is available to residents of the Town of Lyons. One resident parking pass per household is free to residents within town limits, a second pass may be obtained for \$40. Please note that golf carts are considered vehicles.

The parking fee for 2026 is \$2 per hour on weekdays and off-season weekends, and \$3 per hour on peak-season weekends. Parking fees are enforced daily. Sign up for your 2026 annual resident parking pass online:

WINTER RECREATION INFORMATION

Unseasonably warm winter weather has made it difficult to maintain a safe ice surface at the outdoor skating rink. Based on staff and Parks and Recreation Commission recommendations, the Board decided not to open the rink this season.

Adult Drop-In Basketball is open for ages 16+ and meets on Thursdays at 8 pm at the Lyons Elementary gym. **Drop-In Pickleball** meets at the multiuse court at Bohn Park every weekday when the weather allows. **Girls Softball registration** for spring opens soon.

EVENT INFO & UPDATES

- Town Hall will be closed on Monday, January 19, 2026 for Martin Luther King day.
- Old Man Winter Rally** returns to Bohn Park in Lyons on Sunday, February 1, 2026. As part of their special event permit, sections of 2nd Ave will be closed (near the Bohn Park entrance north to Park Street) for safety.
- Recent high winds in December highlight that wildfire risk is year-round and conditions can change quickly. Preparing now—by planning evacuation routes, assembling a go-bag, and reviewing the **Town's Wildfire Evacuation Checklist**—helps ensure you can act quickly if needed.

CONVERSION TO TIME OF USE BILLING

Last fall, the Lyons Board of Trustees (BOT) held a public workshop on Time-of-Use (TOU) electric rates and directed staff to move forward with an implementation plan. Over the coming months, Lyons electric customers will continue transitioning to TOU rates, with a redesigned electric bill planned for 2026 to clearly show how energy use aligns with different pricing periods.

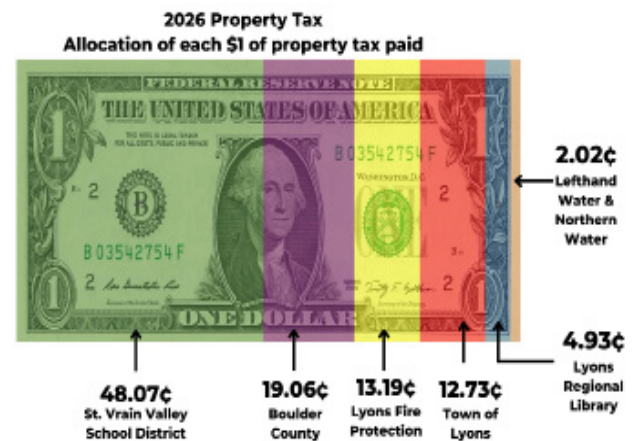
TOU rates are already used by many communities across Colorado and the West. Experience in those communities shows that customers who understand the system and make small timing adjustments can successfully manage, and often lower their electric bills.

Under TOU, electricity costs vary by time of day rather than staying flat. **Off-peak hours (midnight–4 p.m. and 9 p.m.–midnight)** have the lowest rates between 8¢ and 21¢ per kilowatt-hour, while **on-peak hours (5–8 p.m.) will become the most expensive**, roughly 33¢. Customers will experience more savings if they use electricity during off-peak hours, when there is less demand for electricity.

2026 PROPERTY TAXES



Total annual Property Taxes in Lyons are set by each district's mill levy. Each taxing district has a different mill levy. The image above is a graphical representation of local property taxes and the allocation to each district. In Lyons, 48.07 cents of each dollar in property taxes goes to the SVVSD. The Town of Lyons receives 12.73 cents of each dollar.
