Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program

The SNAP program—formerly called “food stamps”—helps individuals and families with food costs. Recipients use an EBT card, which works like a debit card at grocery store checkout.

Housing Choice Voucher (HCV, also known as “Section 8”):

Rent assistance for individuals and families with very low income. BCHA and Boulder Housing Partners (BHP) receive federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to administer the voucher program. “Housing Choice” refers to the resident’s ability to find the home where they’d like to live within the community. “Voucher” refers to the agreement between the resident and the administrator to share the rent payment to the landlord. Residents secure their own housing, then the administrator will pay a rent subsidy directly to the landlord and the resident pays the balance due to the landlord.

Voucher availability is limited and vouchers are provided to residents through a lottery system. Check with BHP and BCHA for when their next lotteries will be and how to apply.

Project-Based Voucher (PBV): Offers rent assistance tied to specific rental units. Eligible residents can receive affordable housing in designated properties managed by the Boulder County Housing Authority (BCHA) or Boulder Housing Partners (BHP).

Boulder County Property Tax Exemption

The county assessor offers a property tax exemption for qualifying seniors and disabled veterans.

This can lead to a 50% exemption on the first \$200,000 of property value, equating to a tax reduction of around \$500. Residents must apply to receive the exemption.

Lyons Public Schools

Lyons schools are part of the St. Vrain Valley School District.

Lyons Elementary serves children from preschool through fifth grade in a small-school environment. Its mission is “to educate all students to their highest potential by fostering a cooperative, creative, and community-based environment.” The school’s Community School program includes after-school child care for students in kindergarten through fifth grade. Child Care Assistance Program (CCAP)

Provides financial assistance to pay for a portion of child care costs for low-income families with children from birth to age 12. CCAP is accepted at many before- and after-school programs, daycare centers, preschools, and summer camps. Eligibility: Adult or teen caretakers/parents residing in Boulder County that are in an eligible activity and meet the income limits set forth. Eligible activities include employment, self-employment, job searching (time limited), and educational activities (time limited). Offers free infant, toddler, and preschool programming for children from low-income families. Partial- and full-day preschool classes available. For infants and toddlers, parents choose between bringing children to the center for up to eight hours per day, or receiving 1.5 hours per week of in-home assistance. The Wild Plum Center welcomes children with disabilities and children who have not been successful in other child-care environments. Services are offered in both English and Spanish.
